

Falmouth Classics Maritime Village Custom House Quay 2026

Terms and conditions

Booking, arrival and departure

- a) Persons wishing to exhibit must apply using the official form which must be completed in full and returned on or before 31 March 2026.
- b) Custom Quay will be open for the erection of stands from 08.00 on Friday 12th June, 2026. All vehicles must be removed by 11.30 and stands should be ready for business from 12.00, closing at 17:00 or later if you wish to do so.
- c) On Saturday stands should be open from 10.00 and should be open until at least 17.00. If you wish to close later, please do so.
On Sunday stands should be open from 10:00 until at least 15:30.
- d) Stands can be removed from 15.30 onwards on Sunday and should be cleared by 19.00. All items including rubbish should be removed.

Payment of fees

The fee per 4x4 metre pitch is £215 + VAT, Electricity Supply £15 + VAT, for the whole event.

A non-refundable deposit of £60.00 (includes VAT) is required to secure a space on Custom House Quay and is to be paid on return of this booking form.

The balance must be paid on receipt of the full invoice within the period prescribed. The fee includes 24/7 security and a Village Manager.

Risks

Safe custody and loss or damage of any items brought to the exhibition must be covered by the exhibitors.

Inclement weather – the exhibitor should insure against any losses they may incur if the Village is cancelled or is abandoned during the period of the event.

An electrical supply is available at the organiser's discretion to a few pitches at a cost TBC.

The organisers accept no responsibility for any interruption of supply by whatever event and the exhibitor should take the necessary precautions themselves to mitigate any losses incurred by such an event.

Event tents and gazebos

The exhibitor is responsible for providing their own event tents and gazebos which should be of commercial quality and suitable for the conditions. The surface of the Quay is asphalt and therefore adequate weights will be required to ensure security in high winds.

General

- a) Stands selling products requiring a licence are responsible for ensuring they have the correct documentation.
- b) The sale of BB guns (plastic or metal balls) catapults, cross bows, high powered water pistols and other similar items will not be permitted.
- c) No exhibitor is permitted to use broadcasting or amplification equipment in the village.
- d) Mains power will not be available other than to exhibitors as determined at the discretion of the organisers (see Risks).

Requirements

- a) All exhibitors must have **public liability insurance (£2.5million) and insurance for their stock and equipment**. Policies for both should be provided to **Falmouth Classics Association by June 1st, 2026**, and retained on the stand.
- b) All exhibitors will be required to provide a **Risk Assessment** covering the site and fire risk to the **Falmouth Classics Association by June 1st 2026**. Risk assessments should also be kept on stands.
- c) All exhibitors must comply with the Health and Safety Act. Reference should be included in the risk assessments
- d) All exhibitors are advised to have fire extinguishers available on their stands compatible with the items and equipment on show and to have suitably trained staff in their use.

Cancellation

Should an exhibitor cancel a stand the following rates apply on receipt of written confirmation - after April 1st – refund of 50%, after May 1st no refund.
